### WHERE YOU CAN TAKE A POTTERY CLASS?

### HOW YOU CAN HANG OUT WITH THE POLICE ON YOUR FRONT PORCH?

The Columbia Police Department carries out periodic "Front Porch Roll Calls" when invited by citizens or neighborhoods. These Roll Calls are meant to give citizens and officers the opportunity to build relationships, impact changes and develop trust within communities. ### WHAT % OF ROADS IN COLUMBIA ARE OWNED BY THE CITY?

Approximately 30% of the roads in Columbia are owned and maintained by the City of Columbia. The remainder are controlled by the South Carolina Department of Transportation, County governments or are privately held.

Residents can drop off electronic equipment for recycling at our Public Works Department located at 2910 Colonial Drive. ### WHERE YOUR STORM WATER GOES?

Water that enters our stormdrains flows directly into nearby streams, creeks, rivers and other waterways and ultimately the ground we live on. This water is NOT treated before it reaches our waterways. We all can do our part to help keep our waterways clear by preventing pollution from running down our stormdrains.
